the challenge

NWFD had recently built a brand-new facility to consolidate all of its departments under one roof, from HR to finance and everything in between. To keep constant watch on people coming in and out of the facility, NWFD needed a modern security camera solution.

With a large service area and a lean staff, NWFD had its hands full keeping residents of northwest Tucson safe. While a robust video and security camera infrastructure would certainly improve the capabilities of NWFD and its organization, nobody has time to manage the equipment or to keep tabs on cameras.

For Robert Dutcher, IT Manager for NWFD, the key to an effective camera strategy is efficiency. His small team of 4-5 IT personnel was tasked with maintaining all the infrastructure for NWFD, and they were already stretched thin. Adding camera maintenance to their list would have been too much to ask for.

"With our new building coming online, and having rooms dedicated with RFID and door sensors to control access, we need to be able to record that as well so we can have a visual on what's happening or what could happen in that room," says Dutcher. "We're a small team, and we wear a lot of different hats, so we needed a solution that could provide consistency as well as ease of use."

Dutcher and his team began researching solutions that could give NWFD the camera coverage they needed without increasing administrative overhead. The solution had to be able to share footage easily and quickly with law enforcement without having to deal with saving large files to flash drives or some other portable storage medium. NWFD also wanted to leverage advanced detection capabilities so that they could provide as much detail as possible to law enforcement in the event of an incident.
